Biographies

Federico García Lorca Writer

Born in 1898 near Granada, Lorca was a poet, a playwright and a theatre director. He wrote many collections of poems including *Gypsy Ballads* and *Poet in New York*. His plays include *The Butterfly's Evil Spell*, *The Billy-Club Puppets*, *The Puppet Play of Don Cristóbal*, *Marina Pineda*, *The Shoemaker's Prodigious Wife*, *The Love of Don Perlimplin and Belisa in the Garden*, *The Public*, *When Five Years Pass*, *Blood Wedding*, *Yerma*, *Doña Rosita the Spinster*, *Play Without a Title*, *The House of Bernarda Alba* and *Dreams of my Cousin Aurelia* (unfinished). His work was banned by Franco's regime and he was executed by Nationalist forces at the start of the Spanish Civil War in 1936.

Ursula Rani Sarma Translator

Ursula Rani Sarma is an Irish playwright and screenwriter. Her theatre work includes: *West* (monologue); *A Thousand Splendid Suns* (adaptation of Khaled Hosseini's novel); *Joanne*; *Yerma* (adaptation); *Riot*; *The Dark Things*; *The Magic Tree*; *The Exchange*; *The Spider Men*; *Blue*; *When the War Came*; *Touched*; *Orpheus Road*; *Gift*; and *Like Sugar on Skin*. She has also written extensively for television where her work includes: *Meadowlands* (Netflix); *The Split Up* (Sister Pictures/BBC); *Bodkin* (Wild Atlantic/Netflix; *Smother* (Tresure Entertainment / BBC Studios / RTÉ One); *Delicious* (Bandit TV/Sky); *Silent Witness* (BBC).

Sarah Esdaile Director

Sarah's television credits include multiple episodes of EastEnders, two feature length episodes of The Chelsea Detective and six episodes of Call the *Midwife* including the upcoming two part Christmas Special. Theatre work includes: 40th Anniversary production of Abigail's Party and Talking Heads (Theatre Royal Bath and tour), *Single Spies* (Rose Theatre), *Paxo* - a one man show with Jeremy Paxman (Pleasance Theatre London and Edinburgh), Cat on a Hot Tin Roof, The Deep Blue Sea, Crash, Death of a Salesman, The Grouch (West Yorkshire Playhouse), where she was an Associate Director. The Lady in the Van (Hull Truck Theatre/UK tour), Sleeping Beauty, Cling to Me Like Ivy, His Dark *Materials* (Birmingham Repertory Theatre), *Life X* 3 (Watermill Theatre), *The Horse Marines* (Theatre Royal, Plymouth), Drowning on Dry Land (Salisbury Playhouse), Kafka's Dick (Watford Palace), James and the Giant Peach (M.E.N Award) and The BFG

(Octagon Theatre), *The Taming of the Shrew* (RSC), *Pictures of Clay* (Royal Exchange), *Coyote on a Fence* (Royal Exchange/Duchess Theatre), (M.E.N Award), *Compact Failure* (Arcola Theatre/Clean Break), *The Maiden's Prayer* and *See How Beautiful I am* (Bush Theatre). Sarah was Associate Director on Michael Boyd's award winning *Histories Tetralogy* at the RSC. At Shakespeare's Globe, Sarah assisted on the inaugural production of *Henry V*.

Sammy Dowson Designer

Sammy trained in theatre design at the Slade School of Fine Art. She was Resident Designer at the Orange Tree Theatre in Richmond from 2000 – 2014, designing over 70 in-the-round productions, notably with Sam Walters, Sean Holmes, Christopher Morahan, Caroline Smith, Peter Leslie Wild, Chris Monks, Alan Strachan, Martin Crimp, Auriol Smith, Tim Sheader, Ellie Jones, David Lewis, and Tim Carroll. Since 2014 Sammy has designed multiple works for: The Oldham Coliseum, Chipping Norton Theatre (touring), The Dukes Lancaster (touring). And in London, for the Other Palace, The Arcola, Latchmere 503 (Offie nominated) and Arts and Gardens Outdoor Opera.

Sammy is an associate of BOLD Theatre designing BOLD beginnings (six short films during Covid), What They Forgot to Tell Us and The Foreigners Panto. She has also designed multiple shows for RADA and CENTRAL and lectures at The Royal Central School of Speech and Drama.
