Biographies

Nicholas Wright Writer

Nicholas Wright was born in South Africa and came to the UK in 1958 to train as an actor attending the London Academy of Music and Dramatic Art (LAMDA). His early career included working as a floor assistant at the BBC and a runner in film. Later he became the first director of the Royal Court's Theatre Upstairs staging an innovative programme of new writing. He has written many original plays including: 8 Hotels, Travelling Light, The Last of the Duchess, The Reporter, Vincent in Brixton (winner of the Olivier Award for Best New Play 2003) and Mrs Klein (performed at RADA in 2018). His adaptations include: Regeneration by Pat Barker, Thérèse Raquin by Émile Zola and His Dark Materials by Philip Pullman. His opera libretti include: Marnie, The Little Prince and Man on the Moon.

Jatinder Verma

Director

Jatinder Verma came to Britain in 1968 as part of the "Exodus" of Asians from Kenya, founding theatre company Tara Arts in 1977 as a response to a racist murder.

He has worked with a wide range of theatres and was the first non-white director at the National, where he directed Moliere's *Tartuffe*.

After helping develop the new Tara Theatre into Britain's first multicultural theatre building, he formed a new company, JVP, with designer Claudia Mayer to continue cross-cultural projects across a range of media. In 2017 he was awarded an MBE for services to diversity in the arts.

Claudia Mayer

Designer

Claudia Mayer spent her early years in India before moving to the UK. After working freelance in opera, dance and theatre she joined Tara Arts as Resident Designer. While at Tara she designed the *Ramayana* exhibition for the British Library, cowrote children's plays and a radio version of the *Mahabharata* with Jatinder Verma and collaborated on the building of Tara's award-winning new theatre building in Wandsworth. Until Covid hit she taught an annual course in stage design at the National Drama School in Delhi.

Lighting Designer

Amy works across theatre, dance, site-specific and devised performance. She trained at RADA on the postgraduate Stage Electrics and Lighting Design course and has a degree in Stage Management and Performing Arts from the University of Winchester. In 2015 she won the Knight of Illumination Award in the musicals category for *Sweeney Todd*. Amy is represented by Davina Shah at TEAM.

Recent Credits include: *The Boy With Two Hearts* (National Theatre); *The Last Return* (Galway,Traverse,Gate); *How A City Can Save The World* (Sheffield Crucible); *Girl On An Altar* (Kiln Theatre).

Marco is a sound engineer with more than 15 years of experience working in London's West End theatres and for the Royal National Theatre. In the last few years he has been exploring Sound Design and Sound Recording for film. Working on a variety of drama, art, commercial and educational projects for companies such as the British Council, i-D magazine, TrustPilot, SIFA (Singapore International Festival of the Arts) and The Royal Court Theatre.
